A full repipe replaces all supply lines and often drain lines with modern material—copper, PEX, or PVC depending on the application and local code. 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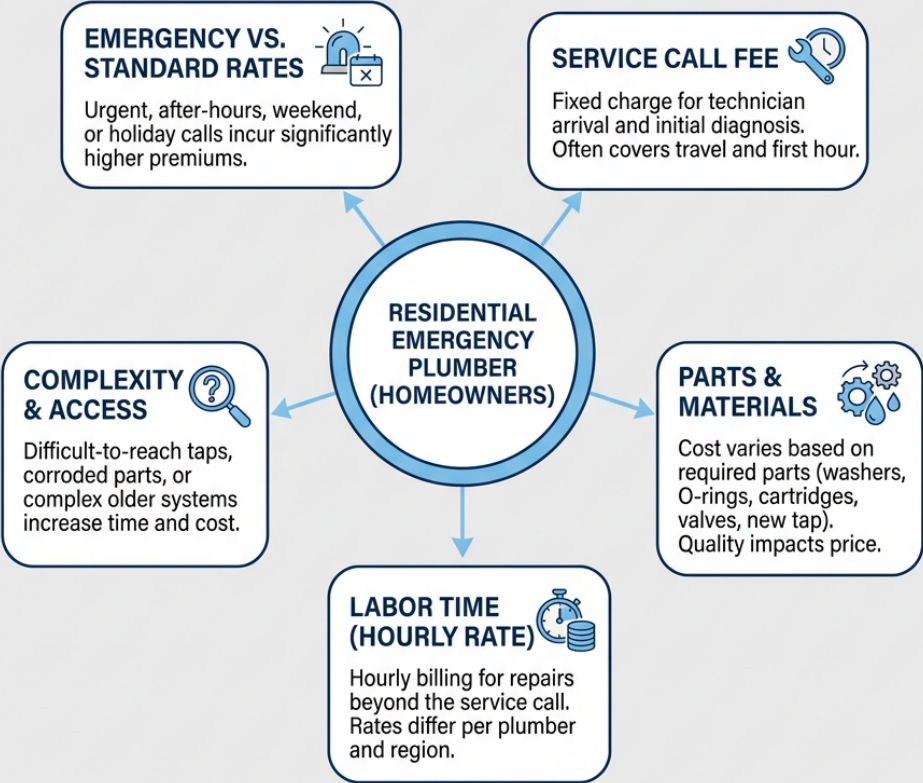
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
