



If you have actually resided in Alexandria for more than a couple of seasons, you already understand the city's plumbing has personality. Block rowhouses conceal cast iron heaps. Mid-century cattle ranch homes mingle copper, galvanized steel, and the occasional enigma PVC. Cellars tease with the groundwater level after a difficult rain. Throw in fully grown tree origins and the clay dirt along the Potomac, and you obtain a perfect recipe for slow drains, reoccurring blockages, and backed-up drains.
