

Hempstead is the kind of Texas town that rewards the traveler who slows down a little. It sits west of Houston in Waller County, close enough to the city for a day trip, but far enough away that the pace changes as soon as you leave the busier corridors and start seeing more open land, older storefronts, and the wide shoulders of Highway 290 country. A visitor passing through might notice the big sky first. Someone staying a while will notice something else, a place that still carries its history in the layout of its streets, in the local events that bring people together, and in the details that make a small town feel lived in rather than staged.
