

Is a Specialist Able to Support a "Thank You" Gathering After the Original Occasion?

Ways a Professional Can Support with a Follow-Up Meal

A coordinator can help with pretty much every detail of a secondary event just as they do the main party.

This involves locating and booking the setting, coordinating with caterers or restaurants, handling invitations and responses, planning fitting aesthetics for a lunch-time, relaxed occasion, and coordinating the timeline during the actual event.



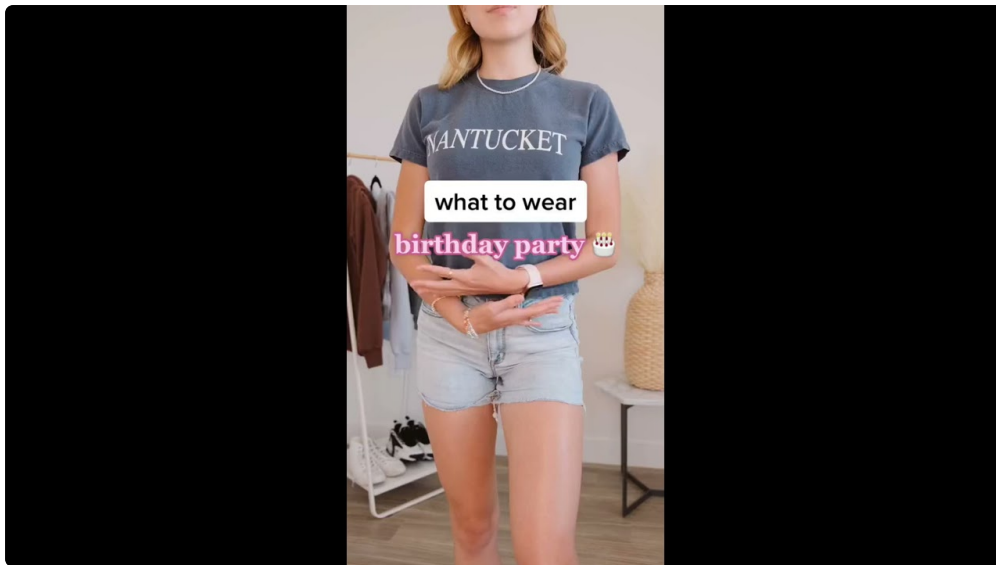
They're also able to deal with the details of transitioning from the main party to the luncheon if the events are happening on different days or if they're on the same date.

Pricing Factors

The investment for a thank-you luncheon to your specialist's responsibilities will depend on what you're asking them to do.

If the follow-up event is very easy and doesn't call for much extra effort, they may ask for a reduced fee or include it as a courtesy if you've already hired them for the main event.

If it's a [Kollysphere Events](#) different, sizable celebration, they'll usually charge their normal price for a second occasion.



The wisest choice is to be upfront with your planner about your expectations and seek their advice on how to handle the logistics for the most efficient use of resources.
