Example Cost Structure

To highlight the economics of a typical 10-person battle, think about a lobby that uses the "Gamma 2" case ([≈ £ best CS2 case battles](#) 2.30 per case). Each participant purchases one case, so the total pot is £ 23.00. The platform takes a 5% commission (£ 1.15), leaving £ 21.85 to be distributed as follows:

In practice, payments differ widely because the skins dropped can be worth anywhere from a couple of cents to several hundred dollars.

Leading 5 Tips for Beginners

- Start Small**-- Choose low-cost cases (e.g., CS: GO Weapon Case, Operation Bravo) to familiarise yourself with the circulation without running the risk of large bankrolls.
- Understand the Drop Tables**-- Each case has a known probability distribution. Understanding which skins are "unusual" helps set sensible expectations.
