Update GPU motorists and lower texture settings. **BSOD (Blue Screen of Death)** Severe hardware instability or RAM/CPU overclock failure. Move CS2 to an SSD and clear the cache. **Random Freezes mid-match** Thermal throttling or background software interference. Screen temperatures and close unnecessary apps.

Fixing Checklist: How to Fix CS2 Crashes

1. Verify Game File Integrity

- Open Steam and browse to your **Library**.

2. Update Graphics Drivers

3. Change In-Game Video Settings

4. Handle Overlays and Background Applications

Overlays are infamous for causing hook conflicts with the Source 2 engine. Consider disabling:

- Discord Overlay
- Steam Overlay (Right-click CS2 in Steam > > Properties > > General > Enable the Steam Overlay while in-game -> >
- Toggle OFF)NVIDIA GeForce Experience Shadowplay/ In-Game Overlay
- Third-party overclocking and tracking software like MSI Afterburner or RivaTuner Statistics Server (RTSS).
