

Whether to repair or replace pipes depends on the severity and location of defects captured during sewer camera inspection. How Do Established Inspection Grading Standards Help Determine if Your Pipes Can Be Safely Repaired?

A pipe rated as a 2 or 3 on the PACP scale—minor cracks or surface deterioration—is typically a repair candidate. What Measured Slope Deficiencies Tell You About Repair Viability?

Sewer lines must maintain a minimum 2-percent downhill slope (0.25 inches of drop per 10 feet of run) to allow gravity-fed flow and prevent standing water. Camera inspections measure this slope precisely. If our inspection identifies belly sections—areas where the pipe sags and traps sewage—repair alone cannot restore proper slope. A localized belly might be patched, but a widespread slope problem signals that replacement is the only way to restore function long-term. Hard water and mineral buildup in Los Angeles create additional slope complications. Over time, deposits can reduce interior diameter and throw off the slope calculation. Our camera inspection reveals whether the defect is structural (a cracked, collapsed, or misaligned pipe that cannot be fixed by cleaning) or deposit-related (something that might clear with hydro-jetting). This distinction is critical: if the slope itself is compromised by physical damage, cleaning alone will not save the line.

How Root Intrusion Severity Documented in Camera Reports Affects Repair Costs?

Root intrusion is one of the most common reasons homeowners ask whether repair or replacement makes financial sense. A camera inspection grades root invasion on severity. Small offsets (under 3mm) might be monitored or repaired with flexible liners. A camera inspection reveals corrosion patterns: uniform surface rust, deep pitting, or perforations where the pipe is beginning to leak. The PACP scale documents corrosion extent. Light corrosion (1-2 rating) suggests the pipe has years of remaining life and repair is reasonable. Heavy pitting and perforation (4-5 rating) means the structural integrity is compromised and replacement is inevitable—you are deciding whether to replace now or after an emergency failure.
