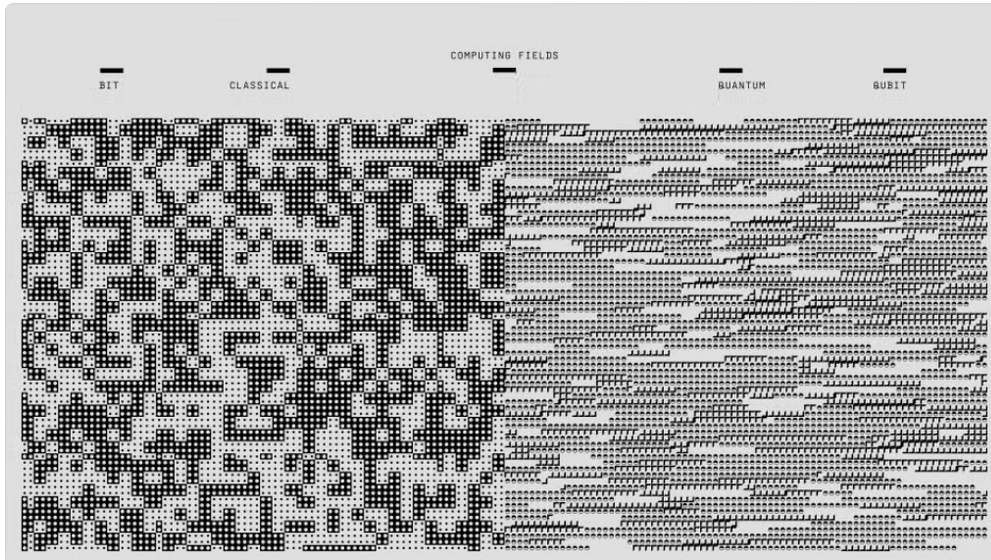

But what if instead of a single AI model chatting with you, multiple AI models read and respond to each other's outputs in a shared thread?
