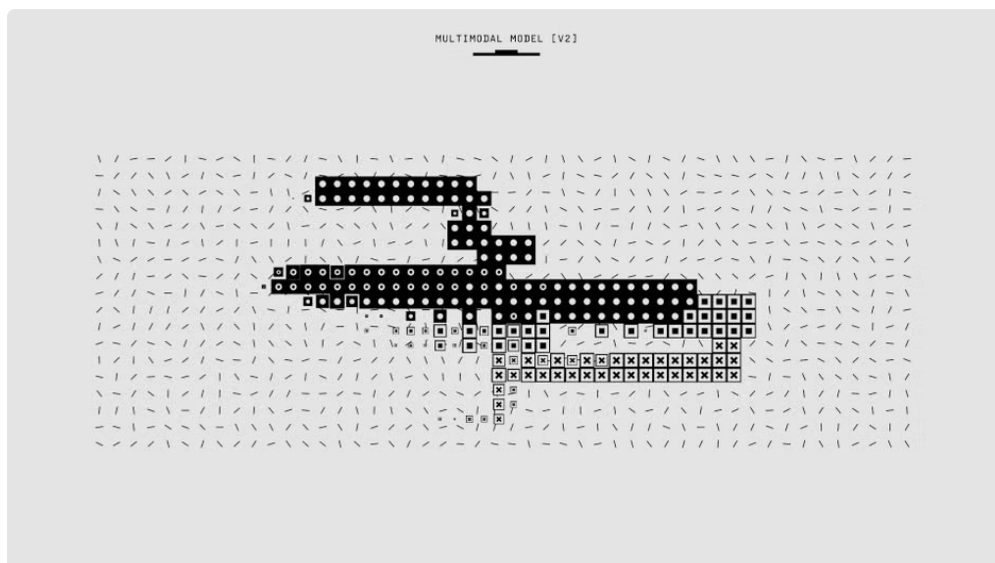
Pricing Transparency vs Free Beta: What Procurement Teams Should Know
