- **The Martingale System:** A classic wagering technique where a gamer doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus a revenue equivalent to the original base bet. Nevertheless, this requires a massive bankroll and can rapidly hit website betting limits.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses decreased to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the intention of claiming enormous multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This functions similar to playing the lottery.
