Live roulette	Comparable to conventional live roulette, but usually featuring 3 colors (e.g., Red, Black, and Green/Zero) corresponding to different payment multipliers (2x, 2x, and 14x). Fixed house edge based on the green/zero sectors.	
Case Opening	Simulates the in-game case opening experience, however typically on third-party sites with custom-curated chances and higher-tier benefit swimming pools. Incredibly variable; usually favors your home heavily.	
Coinflip	An uncomplicated 1v1 PvP game where 2 gamers wager skins of roughly equal worth. A virtual coin is flipped, and the winner takes the entire pot. 50/50 odds, minus a little platform commission (rake).	
Jackpot	Several	

gamers contribute skins to a main pot. Each skin's value determines the player's "ticket" share. A spinner picks one winner who takes whatever. Based upon the overall worth contributed; platform takes a percentage fee.

Features of Modern CSGO Casinos
