on close inspection or specific high-friction locations. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious scratches and use on the body and paintwork. The most common market tier. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, fading colors, and prominent scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed, rusted, or scraped. Some skins look entirely various (and distinctively gritty) in this condition.

Loadouts in CS2 are classified by weapon [CSGO Gambling Site](#) types, with gamers normally choosing a main rifle (AK-47 for Terrorists, M4A4 or M4A1-S for Counter-Terrorists), a sniper rifle (AWP), and sidearms.
