4. Significant Tournaments and View Passes

Throughout Valve-sponsored CS2 Major championships, viewers can buy or sometimes make Souvenir Packages.

- By viewing the tournament live via the Steam TV or in-game customer, or by taking part in the Pick 'Em Challenge using a Viewer Pass, players can make Souvenir Cases particular to that competition.
- These cases do not require a crucial to open, making them 100% complimentary worth when acquired.
