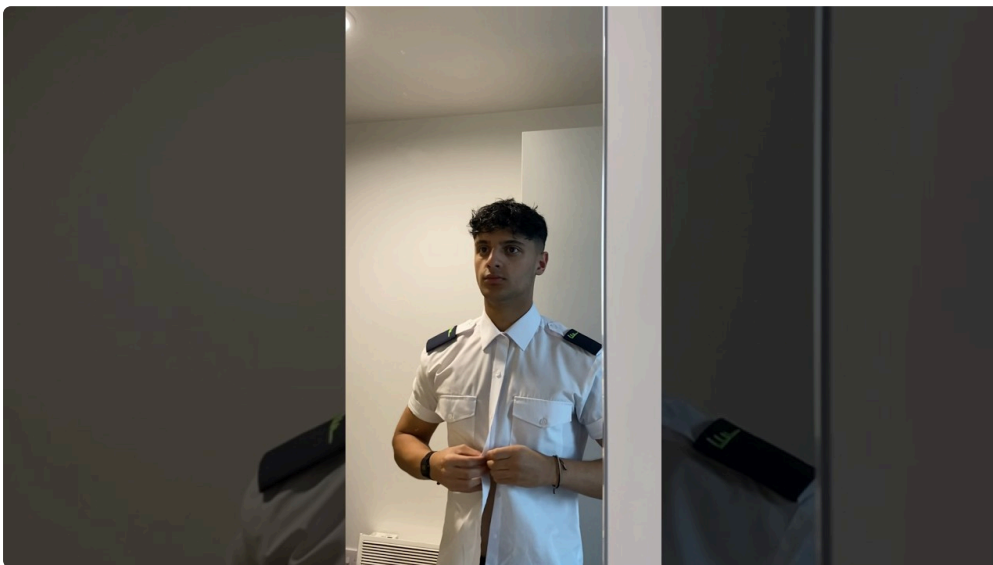
A closing thought, based in actual experience
