For long-distance moves, ask whether the company regularly handles interstate transportation and whether it serves your destination state.

Ask About the Moving Crew

The moving crew will handle your belongings directly, so ask how movers are trained and whether the company uses employees or independent contractors.

Professional movers should understand safe lifting techniques, proper loading procedures, furniture protection, and safe navigation through tight spaces.
