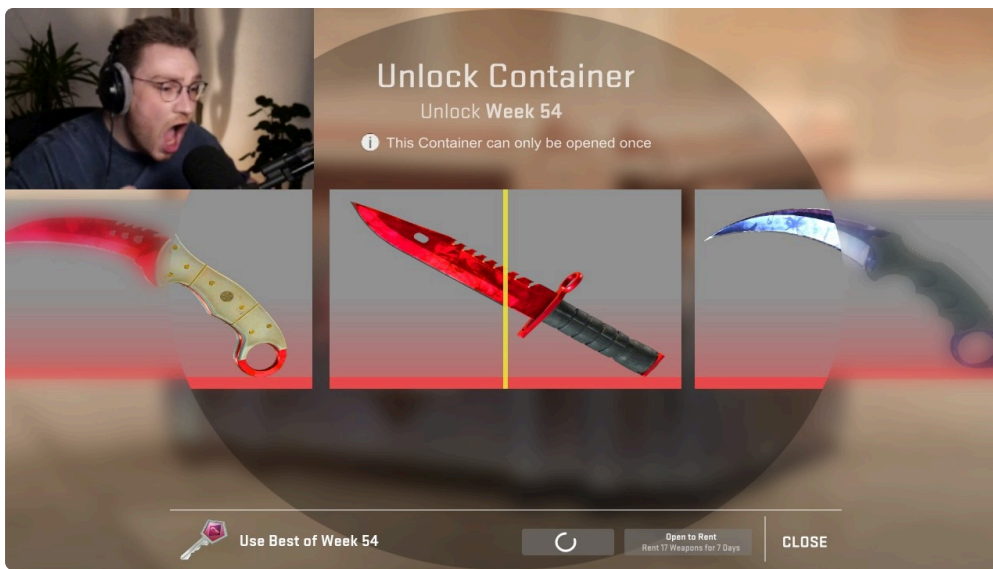
5. Key Factors to Consider Before Buying
