The transaction loop generally follows these actions:

1. **Purchase/Acquisition:** A player gets a skin through the Steam Community Market, third-party markets, or random drops in-game.
2. **Deposit:** The player logs into a CS2 gambling establishment using their Steam account and initiates a trade deal with a site bot, transferring the skin.
3. **Conversion:** The site values the skin (frequently somewhat listed below market value to guarantee revenue for the platform) and credits the user's account balance.
4. **Wagering:** The user plays games on the platform.
5. **Withdrawal:** If successful, the user chooses brand-new skins from the site's bot inventory and requests a trade deal.
