 - *Perfect Pair* (Exact exact same match and rank): Typically pays 25:1
2. **21 +3:** This side bet combines the gamer's very first two cards with the dealer's upcard to form a three-card poker hand. Payouts are structured as follows:
 - *Flush* (Same match): 5:1
 - *Straight* (Sequential ranks): 10:1
 - *3 of a Kind* (Same rank): 30:1
 - *Straight Flush*: 40:1
 - *Matched Trips* (Identical 3 of a kind): 100:1
3. **Insurance coverage:** Offered when the dealership's upcard is an Ace. Players can bet as much as half their original bet that the dealer has a 10-value hole card (making a blackjack). If effective, it pays 2:1.
Mathematically, basic strategy recommends against taking insurance coverage over the long run, as the house edge on this particular bet is high.

Unique Payout Structures in Variant Live Games
