Using Plain-English Terminology to Improve Transparency

Another frequent source of confusion is the use of jargon, marketing buzzwords, or ambiguous terms in summaries. Plain-English terminology aids comprehension and helps spot missing or unclear details.

Why Avoid Ambiguous Terms?

- Words like “epic,” “huge,” or “powerful” convey excitement without specifying effective impact.
- Phrases such as “unlimited features” often omit fine print or actual feature caps.
- Terms like “random,” “mystery,” or “chance” should be supplemented with conditions or probabilities when possible.

Summaries should use clear terms such as:

- *“Up to 20 free spins per round”* instead of *“tons of free spins”*
- *“Multiplier increases by 1x for each triggered bonus”* rather than *“increasing multipliers”*
- *“Feature activates when 3 scatter symbols appear”* instead of *“feature triggers randomly”*

If a summary uses vague language, it may be hiding omitted conditions or limitations you'll want to verify in the full rulebook.

Highlighting Feature Trigger Conditions and Limitations

Trigger conditions and limitations are essential to understanding when and how game features activate or cease. These conditions are routinely missing from short summaries yet are vital for accurate comprehension.



Commonly Omitted Trigger Details

- The exact symbols or events required to start bonuses or special rounds.
- Whether triggers can recur within a single game session or only once.

Such conditions are critical but often only appear in comprehensive rule sheets rather than summaries.
