

A malfunctioning garage door can affect safety, convenience, and access to your home. Whether the garage door will not open, closes unequally, makes a noisy garage door sound, or has stopped responding to the remote, the proper repair depends on the problem. In Los Angeles, pricing and availability can also change by neighborhood, door design, and the age of the home.
