- **The Martingale System:** A classic wagering strategy where a player doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recuperate all previous losses plus a profit equal to the initial base bet. Nevertheless, this requires a massive bankroll and can rapidly strike site betting limitations.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses decreased to the base bet amount.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the intent of holding out for massive multipliers (50x, 100x, or higher). This functions much like playing the lottery.
