

How Texas Proportionate Responsibility Affects Your Midland Crash Claim Yes, you can usually still recover money in Texas even if you were partly to blame for a crash. The rule that decides this is called proportionate responsibility, and it lives in Chapter 33 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. It works like a sliding scale with one hard stop. Your damages are reduced by your share of fault, and if you are found more than 50 percent responsible, you cannot recover at all. What does that look like with real numbers? Take a simple made-up example. Say a jury decides your total damages are \$100,000 and finds you 20 percent at fault for a wreck at Loop 250 and Midkiff Road. Your recovery would be reduced by 20 percent, to \$80,000. If the jury put you at exactly 50 percent, you could still recover half. At 51 percent, you would recover nothing. That single point is why fault arguments in Texas can get so intense. The same math applies whether the crash happened on a busy stretch of Loop 250 north, a side street in east Midland or a rural highway on the way to Stanton. Each case turns on its own facts. Why do insurance companies care so much about percentages? Because every point of fault they can shift onto you lowers what they pay, and pushing you past 50 percent ends the claim entirely. An adjuster may suggest you were speeding on a straight stretch of Andrews Highway, that you should have seen the truck pulling out of a lease road, or that you braked too suddenly on Big Spring Street near downtown Midland. Sometimes the questions come in a friendly recorded call, and your answers get used later. Texas is an at-fault state, so these arguments show up in nearly every contested claim.

Can the percentages be challenged? Often, yes. Fault is decided on evidence, and the insurer's version is only one version. If you were hurt, missed work or the other driver's insurer is disputing fault, a lawyer usually pays for themselves. Texas gives you two years from the crash to file most injury lawsuits, but waiting that long is risky.
