Markets increasingly integrate these metrics, causing nuanced odds shifts—especially during the season when form fluctuates but quality measures offer steadier predictive power.

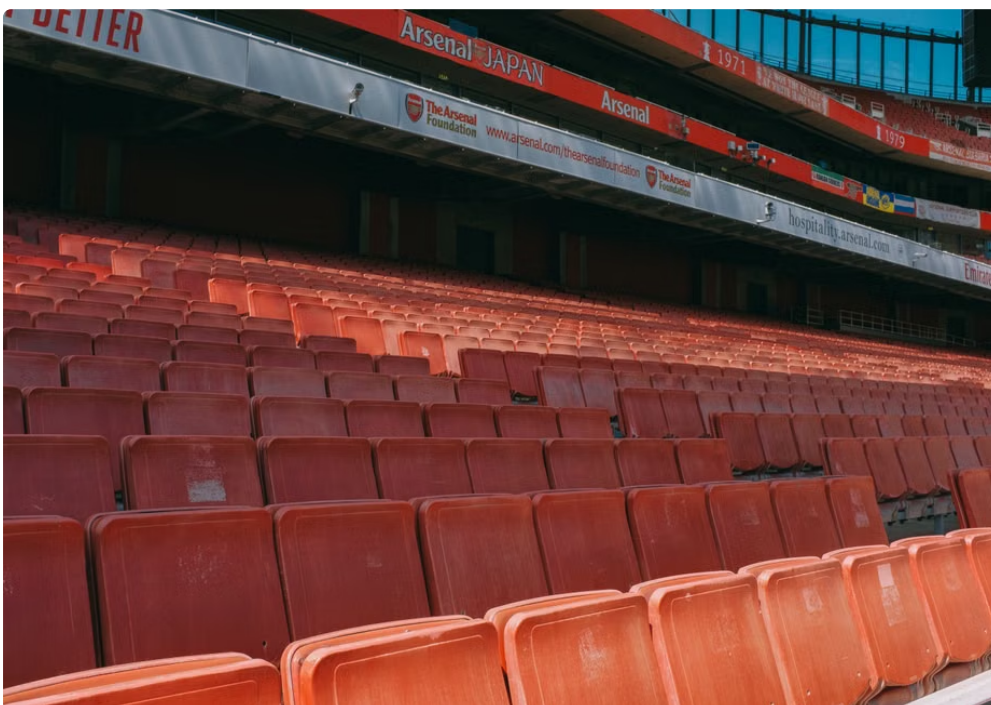
Tactical Matchups and In-Game Adjustments
