This determines whether you need a simple hydro-jetting pass (less expensive, temporary relief) or a full sewer line replacement (more costly, permanent fix). Offset joints—where two pipe sections have shifted and no longer align—are equally common in older homes near Downtown LA Proper Hotel and surrounding neighborhoods. Hydro-Jetting Costs and Camera-Guided Application

Once a sewer camera has documented the blockage—whether roots, grease buildup, or mineral deposits—hydro-jetting can clear it. This high-pressure water jet typically costs \$150 to \$400 and works best when the camera has already shown us the line's overall integrity.
