The Five Wear Categories

When a weapon finish is dropped or unboxed, it is assigned a particular **Float Value** ranging from 0.00 to 1.00. This float figures out how scratched, used, or faded the texture appears in-game.

Use Category Float Value Range In-Game Appearance **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, minimal to no scratches or blemishes. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Really minor wear, generally visible on close evaluation. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Visible scratches and endure popular edges. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Considerable wear, paint fading, and popular scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed, rusted, or severely faded textures.

(Note: Certain products actually look much better or end up being better in greater wear conditions-- such as the "AWP|Asiimov"-- while others demand a beautiful Factory New condition to command high rates.)

Rarity Tiers

Weapon surfaces are more classified by color-coded rarity tiers, which determine how often they appear in cases and trade-ups:

- **Consumer Grade/ Industrial Grade (White/Light Blue):** Common, low-tier items frequently utilized for basic trade-ups.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard drop-tier products.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Uncommon, preferable mid-tier surfaces.
- **Classified (Pink):** Rare and striking designs often central to collections.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest basic weapon tier, featuring iconic styles like the Redline or Fire Serpent.
- **Unique/ Extraordinarily Rare (Gold):** Knives and Gloves. These are the crown jewels of the marketplace.

The Economy: Trading, Markets, and Value

The digital economy surrounding these products is entirely player-driven. Valve sets the standard through official in-game case drops and the Steam Community Market, but a massive external environment exists by means of third-party trading sites, peer-to-peer marketplaces, and neighborhood online forums.

Elements That Influence Price

1. **Supply and Demand:** Items from older, ceased cases are rarer, increasing their market price.
2. **Float and Pattern Templates:** Some products include particular pattern indexes that change the visual appearance entirely (e.g., the "Case Hardened" pattern, where blue quantities determine extreme worth).
3. **Stickers and StatTrak:** Applying uncommon, discontinued tournament sticker labels can increase an item's worth. StatTrak innovation, which tracks the number of kills a player gets with a particular weapon, likewise commands a price premium.
4. **Pro-Player Association:** When a professional esports gamer uses a specific weapon surface during a major competition, demand for that product frequently increases over night.

The Transition to *Counter-Strike 2*

When Valve released the sequel, one of the community's biggest issues was the fate of their digital collections. Fortunately, Valve carried forward each and every single weapon surface, sticker label, and knife into the new engine.



In addition, the transition to the Source 2 engine brought massive visual improvements:

- **Lighting and Reflections:** Metallic finishes now capture light dynamically, making gold and chrome items look staggeringly practical.
- **Geometry Changes:** Many models were discreetly redesigned, permitting finishes to wrap around the weapons with greater fidelity and much better texturing than ever in the past.
- **Examine Animations:** Inspecting products ended up being a mesmerizing experience due to improved physics and lighting interactions.
