

Westhampton Beach has a way of feeling polished without becoming stiff. It is one of those East End villages where the pace changes the minute you leave the busier highways and start moving along tree-lined streets toward the water. The storefronts are compact, the beaches are beautiful without much fuss, and the village still holds onto a sense of place that comes from centuries of living, building, rebuilding, and adapting to coastal weather.
