What is Provably Fair?

- **Customer Seed:** A string supplied by the player's internet browser (or randomized).
- **Nonce:** A number that increments with every bet placed.

Before the round starts, the player receives a hashed variation of the server seed. After the round concludes, the server seed is revealed, permitting the gamer to separately confirm that the crash point was predetermined and not modified mid-flight.

Anatomy of a Crash Round

To visualize how a normal round unfolds, think about the following breakdown:
