Categories of Rarity

To comprehend the community fully, collectors divide rare items into distinct cs2skin.com classifications based upon their origin and distinct characteristics.

1 Contraband and Discontinued Items

Valve is generally hands-off with the economy, however exceptions exist. The **M4A4|Groan** is the sole item classified as "Contraband." Following a copyright conflict over the original art work, Valve changed the design and eliminated the case drop system completely. Anyone holding a Howl kept it, developing a completely topped supply.

Likewise, older operation cases (like the Bravo Case or Huntman Case) no longer drop natively in-game, indicating every time one is opened, the overall worldwide supply completely reduces.

2. The "Blue Gem" Phenomenon

The *Case Hardened* surface is one of the most intricate skin key ins Counter-Strike history. It utilizes a gradient map of blue, purple, and gold that shifts depending on the weapon's pattern index.

- **The Anomaly:** While most Case Hardened skins include a mottled mix of colors, exceptionally unusual pattern variations cover almost 100% of the weapon's surface area in strong blue.
- **The Pricing:** These "Blue Gems"-- especially on the Karambit and the AK-47-- command rates that overshadow factory-new knives of greater tier types.

3. Souvenir Packages from Major Championships

Throughout Valve-sponsored Major competitions, viewers enjoying through Steam or linked platforms could randomly get Souvenir Packages dropped during specific matches.

- These plans come pre-applied with gold competition sticker labels commemorating the groups and the MVP of the round.
- The most famous among them are the **Cobblestone Souvenir Packages** signed by legendary players like Kenny "kennyS" Schrub, consisting of the desirable AWP|Dragon Lore.

What does "Float Value" imply?

Drift worth is a mathematical value between 0.00 and 1.00 that figures out the wear condition of a skin.

- **Factory New:** 0.00-- 0.07
- **Very little Wear:** 0.07-- 0.15
- **Field-Tested:** 0.15-- 0.38
- **Well-Worn:** 0.38-- 0.45
- **Battle-Scarred:** 0.45-- 1.00. Particular skins are "float topped," implying they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making lower-float Minimal Wear variants extremely important.

Valve can modify game mechanics, introduce brand-new case types, or adjust trade policies at any time.
