The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus an earnings equal to the original base bet. However, this requires a massive bankroll and can quickly strike site betting limits.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* instead of a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses decreased to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing little bets with the intention of holding out for massive multipliers (50x, 100x, or higher). This operates much like playing the lottery.
