When you strike the top of a container, especially concrete or fiberglass, the resistance adjustments suddenly. This is where experience assists. A probe pole provides responses via your hands. Roots really feel fibrous and resilient. Rocks really feel little and local. The course of the sewage system line can inform you virtually everything

If yard ideas are weak, map the building drain. Inside the cellar or crawl area, locate the main drainpipe line. It is usually 3 or 4 inches in size. Follow it to the wall where it leaves. Outdoors, continue along that path.
