### The Anatomy of a Finish: What Determines Value?

#### 1. Exterior Wear (Float Value)

Every item drops with a particular "float value" varying from **0.00 to 1.00**, which identifies its physical wear and tear. The float is divided into five official wear classifications:

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Pristine, very little scratches)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Slight acnes, usually near edges)
- **Field-Tested (FT):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear, scratches, or fading)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear, paint breaking)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Extremely worn, in some cases considerably altering the texture)

*Note: Some products look fantastic even in Battle-Scarred condition, while others are prized strictly in Factory New.*

#### 2. Product Rarity Tiers

Valve categorizes weapon finishes into color-coded tiers based on their drop rates in cases or trade-ups.



Rarity Tier Color Code Drop Rate/ Acquisition Method **Customer Grade** White Discovered in weekly drops/ Base game **Industrial Grade** Light Blue Typical drops/ Low-tier case contents **Mil-Spec** Dark Blue Requirement case drops **Limited** Purple Unusual case drops **Categorized** Pink Rare case drops **Covert** Red Really rare case drops (Top-tier basic weapons) **Exotic/ Special** Gold Exceptionally unusual (Knives and Gloves)

### Patterns and StatTrak™: The Elements of Prestige

Beyond float values and rarities, 2 significant features can significantly pump up [CS2skin](#) a product's value: **Pattern Indexes** and **StatTrak™ technology**.

## Pattern Templates

Numerous finishes utilize a procedural generation system where a texture template crosses the weapon model based on a "Paint Seed" (from 1 to 1000). Depending on the seed number, the visual look can alter entirely.

- **Case Hardened:** Famous for its blue and gold distributions. A pattern with a high percentage of solid blue on top can command 10s of thousands of dollars.
- **Fade:** Depending on the seed, the transition from yellow to pink to purple can vary, with "100% Fade" variations fetching leading dollar.

## StatTrak™ Technology

Items geared up with StatTrak™ function a small digital LCD screen connected to the weapon body that tracks the number of verified kills the owner makes with it. While these items drop at the same rate as their non-StatTrak counterparts, they generally command a greater cost on the Steam Community Market and third-party trading websites.

## How to Acquire Them

Constructing a digital inventory can be approached through numerous different methods, each carrying its own risks and rewards.

1. **Opening Cases:** The adventure of the gamble. Gamers buy a weapon case and a matching secret to open a random item. While everyone imagine unpacking an uncommon knife, the mathematical odds heavily prefer your home.
2. **The Steam Community Market:** A safe, Valve-regulated marketplace where players buy and sell products using Steam Wallet funds. Prices here are generally higher due to Valve's transaction fees.
3. **Third-Party Trading Platforms:** Websites focusing on peer-to-peer trading permit users to purchase products using real fiat currency or crypto, frequently at a 15-- 30% discount compared to Steam market value.
4. **Trade-Ups:** A system where players can trade ten products of one rarity tier for one random product of the next greater tier within the same collection.

Due to the fact that high-tier products can be worth as much as real-world automobiles, security is vital. Cybersecurity risks like API frauds and phishing links target inexperienced traders daily.
