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Renting the wrong storage unit typically reveals itself in one of two undesirable methods. You either pay month after month for empty air, or you spend moving day playing a sweaty, frustrating video game of real-life Tetris, encouraged that a person more light, another lug, one more dining chair must in some way fit. The majority of people lean on rough guesses when picking amongst storage units, and that is where problem starts.

A great fit is not practically square footage. It has to do with how your valuables act in a room. A queen mattress is uncomfortable in methods a stack of boxes is not.
