

If you have booked **pest control Mississauga** service, the most effective results often start before the technician arrives. ## **Should I leave my pets at home during pest control treatment?**

It depends on the solution and service type. Find out whether the treatment is safe for pets, and whether pets need to leave the home during spray application or avoid treated rooms until surfaces are dry. For sensitive pets, relocation is often the easiest option.

## **What should I do before mice control in Mississauga?**

Ahead of mice control Mississauga service, remove food clutter, remove storage piles, and ensure the technician can inspect likely entry points and harborage areas. Do not seal holes before the inspection, since the provider may need to check activity before suggesting exclusion or bait stations.
