- **API Restrictions:** By limiting automated trade bots and enforcing trade cooldowns, Valve has made it substantially harder for platforms to process immediate deposits and withdrawals.
- **Account Bans:** Users captured using their Steam stocks for industrial gambling operations risk having their personal Steam accounts completely prohibited, resulting in the loss of their whole video game and skin libraries.

Regardless of these efforts, the demand stays so high that brand-new platforms continually emerge to change those that shut down.
