Some skins look beautiful even in Battle-Scarred condition, while others end up being unrecognizable. This includes another layer of RNG (Random Number Generation) to case openings, greatly affecting the market worth of the dropped item.

The Economics of the Steam Community Market

The CS: GO economy operates on supply and demand, mirroring conventional monetary markets. Valve sets the rate of keys, however the rates of cases and skins are totally player-driven.
