Very Little Wear (MW)	0.07-- 0.15	Extremely light wear, typically a few minor scuffs on close assessment.
Field-Tested (FT)	0.15-- 0.38	Obvious scratches and wear on popular edges and paint.
Well-Worn (WW)	0.38-- 0.45	Significant wear, paint fading, and noticeable scratches throughout the body.
Battle-Scarred (BS)	0.45-- 1.00	Heavily distressed, rusted, or peeling paint. (Some skins look surprisingly cool in this condition!)

The Anatomy of the CS2 Skin Market

The economy surrounding CS2 skins is one of the most interesting micro-economies in gaming history.
