1. **Note the Error Message:** Does the video game crash to desktop (CTD) calmly, or does it show a specific error code (like engine.dll or memory allowance errors)?
2. **Check System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will instantly throttle or shut down procedures to prevent irreversible hardware damage.
3. **Validate Recent Changes:** Did the crash start occurring right away after a Windows upgrade, a graphics motorist update, or the installation of brand-new peripherals?

Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Solutions

1. Confirm Integrity of Game Files

- **AMD Users:** Open AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition, browse to *Checking for Updates*, and set up the suggested software package.
- **Pro Tip:** For persistent issues, perform a "Clean Installation" using an utility like Display Driver Uninstaller (DDU) to wipe old chauffeur caches totally before installing the fresh bundle.

3. Change Launch Options

- Right-click CS: GO in Steam £ \ rightarrow £ **Properties** £ \ rightarrow £ **General**.

 - -autoconfig (Resets video and efficiency settings to default if the game fails to boot entirely)

4. Disable Fullscreen Optimizations

Windows utilizes an internal feature called "Fullscreen Optimizations" to manage borderless windowed modes, which can occasionally hinder DirectX rendering in older source engine games.

- **Step 1:** Navigate to the game installation directory (normally C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ common \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- **Step 2:** Locate the main executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Step 3:** Right-click the file and select **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check the box for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.
- **Step 6:** Click *Apply* and *OK*.

Relative Overview of Common Crash Fixes

To help determine which service to try very first based upon the specific symptom, referral the matrix listed below:

Advanced Troubleshooting

If standard software fixes stop working to deal with the crashing concern, the problem may lie deeper within the operating system or hardware configuration.

Managing Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive players overclock their hardware to eke out every last frame per second (FPS). Nevertheless, source engines can be notoriously conscious unstable overclocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock applied via MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, go back the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to evaluate stability.
- **XMP/EXPO Profiles:** Unstable RAM profiles can trigger unanticipated game crashes and memory read errors. Attempt disabling XMP/DOCP in the BIOS briefly to see if crashes continue.

Running as Administrator

Permissions issues can sometimes prevent the game from writing required cache files to the storage drive.

- Locate csgo.exe, right-click it, select **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and examine **Run this program as an administrator**.

Reinstalling the Game

As a last option, a tidy reinstallation makes sure that no residual conflicting files from old updates remain. Uninstall the game through Steam, by hand erase any staying folders in the steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive directory, and download a fresh copy.
