Outside Condition Drift Value Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful, flawless surface with very little to no visible scratches. **Minimal Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Extremely minor signs of wear, generally visible only on close inspection. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Noticeable scratches and endure popular edges and paint surface areas. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, heavy scratching, and dulled colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Severe wear, rusted metal, greatly chipped paint, and distressed aesthetics.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "float-capped," indicating they can not physically drop in Factory New condition, making their least expensive readily available wear condition very important.
