- **Coinflip:** A classic 1v1 video game where 2 gamers wager comparable skin worths, and a digital coin flip figures out the sole winner.
- **Prize:** Multiple players dispose skins into a common pot. A virtual wheel spins, and the individual who contributed the most has the greatest analytical opportunity of winning the entire swimming pool, though

luck can favor low-tier contributors.

## Comparison of Common CS: GO Gambling Game Types
