

What Extension Springs Handle on an Overhead Garage Door

An **extension spring** supports the weight of an **overhead garage door**. These springs are commonly positioned along the horizontal garage door tracks, one on each side of the door. As the door closes, the springs extend and retain energy. When the door opens, that energy assists in raising the door and reduce the force required from the **garage door opener** or the person operating it.

A properly sized spring makes it possible to lift the **garage door weight**. The springs function together with pulleys and **lift cables** that travel along both sides of the door. Do not dismiss a door that begins to close unevenly or slam shut. The problem may include spring tension, a damaged pulley, a bent garage door track, or a cable that has separated from its drum. Continuing to operate the door can wear down panels and hardware and may present a serious injury hazard.

Garage door safety should remain the top concern. Keep children, pets, and bystanders at a safe distance from a damaged door. Do not stand beneath a raised door that is being supported only by an opener or a provisional object. If the door is unstable, schedule professional repair rather than repeatedly trying it.

Why Extension Spring Repairs Call for Professional Service

Extension springs store considerable energy even when they appear small. Removing or removing one without the proper tools and procedure can cause the spring, cable, pulley, or mounting hardware to move unexpectedly.
