The Mechanics Behind the Scenes: Provably Fair Systems

A major concern for users of CS gambling sites is transparency. To deal with apprehension, reputable platforms carry out **Provably Fair** algorithms.



How Provably Fair Works:

1. **Server Seed:** The website creates a random string of characters and hashes it before the game starts. This hash is shown to the gamer.
2. **Client Seed:** The player's browser produces a random seed (or the gamer can input their own).
3. **The Result:** The server seed and client seed are integrated mathematically to generate the outcome of the video game.
4. **Verification:** After the game, the unhashed server seed is exposed. Players can use open-source verification tools to prove that the platform did not modify the result mid-game.
