The Economics of Unboxing: Expectation vs. Reality

It is crucial to see CS2 unpacking through the lens of entertainment rather than investment. Mathematically, the Expected Value (EV) of opening a standard CS2 case is negative.



When a player opens a case, the huge bulk of the time, they will get a Mil-Spec or Restricted skin that is worth significantly less than the £ 2.50 key used to open it.

- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00
