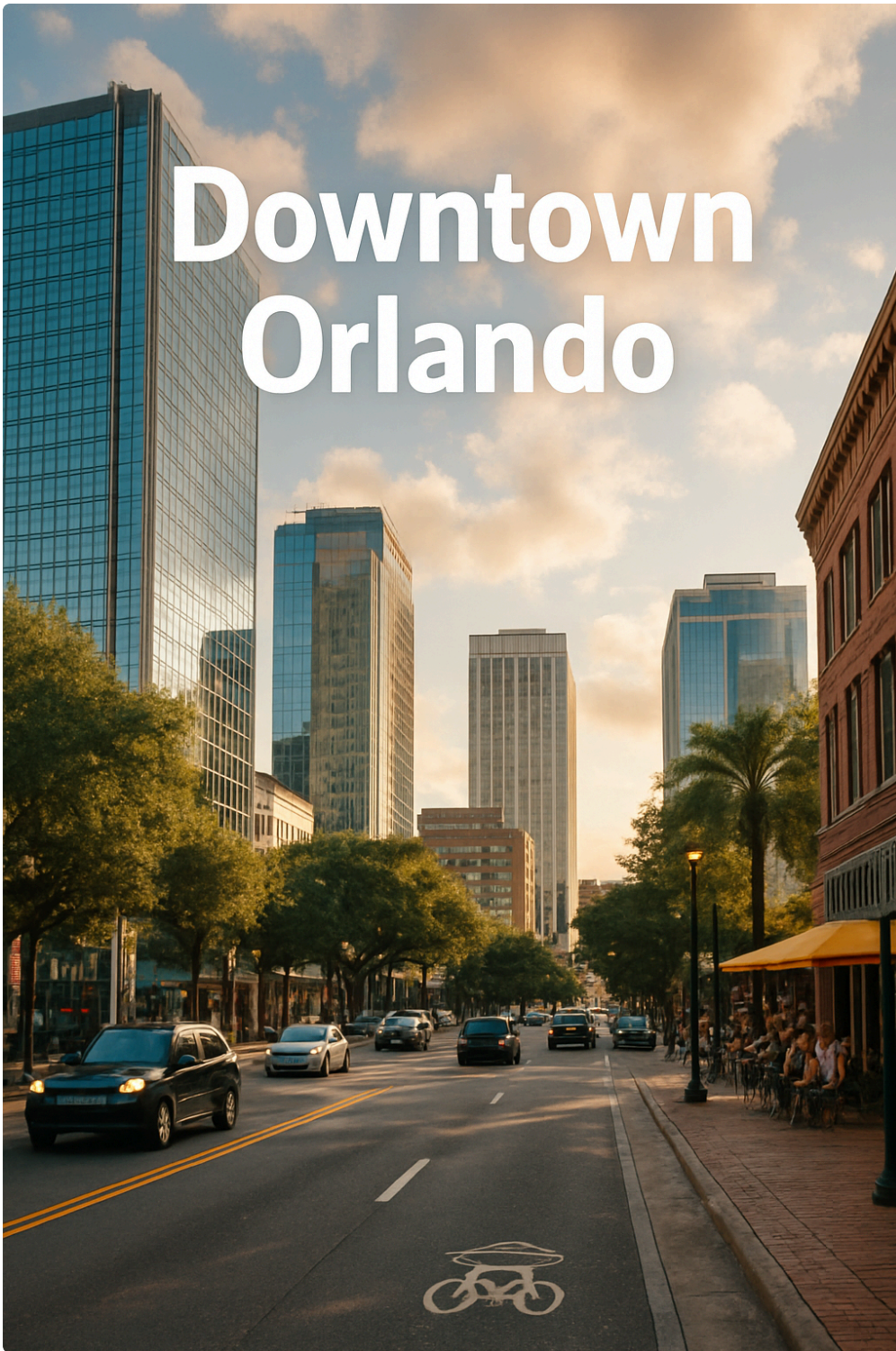
Why credentials matter when the job is urgent
