- **Plinko:** Inspired by the video game program, gamers drop a puck down a pegboard, landing in multipliers that either boost or reduce their initial bet.

4. **The Outcome:** The mix of the server seed, client seed, and nonce is run through an algorithm to create the game result. After the round, the unencrypted server seed is exposed, enabling the player to independently confirm that the outcome was not modified mid-game.
