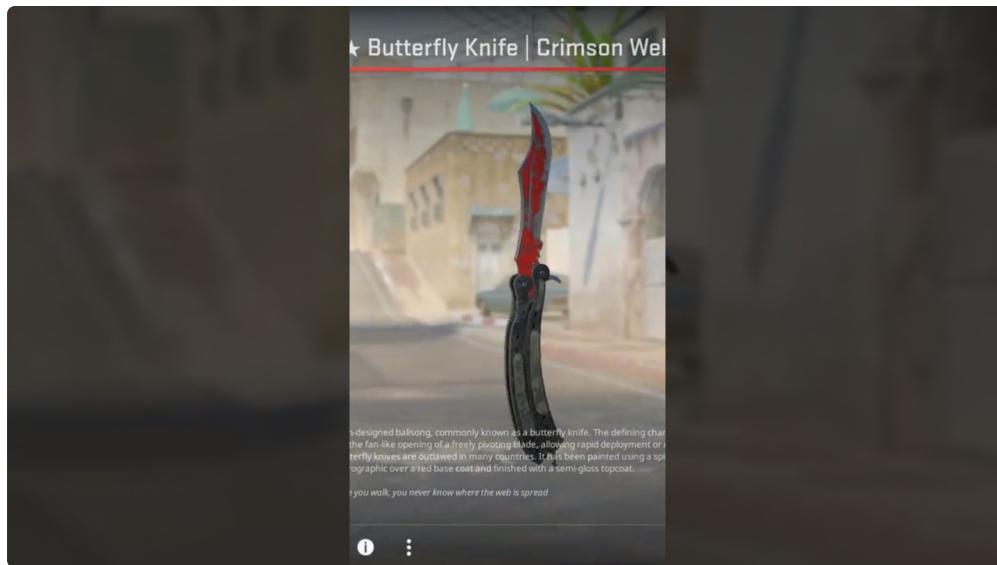

3. Drop Rates and Probabilities

The main drop likelihoods (as published by Valve) for each rarity in a standard CS2 case are:



Rarity Approximate Drop Rate Mil-Spec (Blue) 79.92% Restricted (Purple) 15.98% Classified (Pink) 3.20% Covert (Red) 0.64% Rare Special Item (Gold) -- Knife **0.25%**

Thus, typically, **1 out of every 400 openings** yields a knife (or glove) skin. The [cs2 cases](#) exact knife model (e.g., Bayonet vs. Karambit) is picked from a swimming pool of offered knives for that case, each similarly most likely within the Rare Special Item tier.

5.1. Set a Budget

- **Decide ahead of time** just how much you are prepared to invest in secrets, and stay with that limitation.
