How CSGO Gambling Sites Operate: The Technical Side

Unlike traditional online gambling establishments that utilize fiat currency (GBP, EUR) or cryptocurrencies, CSGO gambling websites rely greatly on **API integration with Steam**.

When a user wishes to deposit or withdraw funds, the procedure typically follows these steps:

1. **Authentication:** The user logs in by means of OpenID through their main Steam account.
2. **Stock Sync:** The site's bot checks out the user's Steam inventory to show their available CSGO skins.
