- **Plinko:** Inspired by the video game show, gamers drop a puck down a pegboard, landing in multipliers that either boost or decrease their preliminary bet.

How Provably Fair Works:

3. **The Nonce:** A counter that increases with every bet put.
4. **The Outcome:** The mix of the server seed, customer seed, and nonce is run through an algorithm to create the video game outcome. After the round, the unencrypted server seed is revealed, allowing the player to independently validate that the result was not altered mid-game.
