Beyond winning and losing, players make strategic options during a hand-- such as doubling down and splitting-- that straight impact the scale of the payout.

- **Double Down:** Players are allowed to double their original wager in exchange for getting one, and only one, additional card. If the doubled hand wins, the payment is determined based upon the *new, doubled total bet*.
- **Dividing Pairs:** When dealt a set, players can split them into 2 separate hands by placing a 2nd bet equivalent to the first. Each hand is then played separately, indicating payments (and losses) are calculated separately for each hand.

While side bets use the attraction of enormous payments, they typically include a significantly greater home edge than the primary video game.

Common Live Blackjack Side Bets

1. **Perfect Pairs:** This wager wins if the gamer's first two cards form a set. The payment depends on the precise nature of the set:
 - *Mixed Pair* (Different colors/suits): Typically pays 6:1
 - *Colored Pair* (Same color, various fits): Typically pays 12:1
 - *Perfect Pair* (Exact exact same match and rank): Typically pays 25:1
2. **21 +3:** This side bet integrates the player's very first 2 cards with the dealer's upcard to form a three-card poker hand. Payments are structured as follows:
 - *Flush* (Same fit): 5:1
 - *Straight* (Sequential ranks): 10:1
 - *3 of a Kind* (Same rank): 30:1
 - *Straight Flush*: 40:1
 - *Suited Trips* (Identical three of a kind): 100:1
3. **Insurance:** Offered when the dealership's upcard is an Ace. Gamers can bet up to half their initial bet that the dealership has a 10-value hole card (making a blackjack). If effective, it pays 2:1. *Mathematically, basic method advises against taking insurance over the long term, as the house edge on this particular bet is high.*

Distinct Payout Structures in Variant Live Games

Lightning Blackjack/ Quantum Blackjack
