- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on expert CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors) using virtual balance or skins, predicting match winners, map scores, or specific in-game events.

Note: Due to Steam trade holds (a 7-day trade restriction positioned on freshly traded items), withdrawing physical skins can often need waiting a week before the product is tradable once again.
