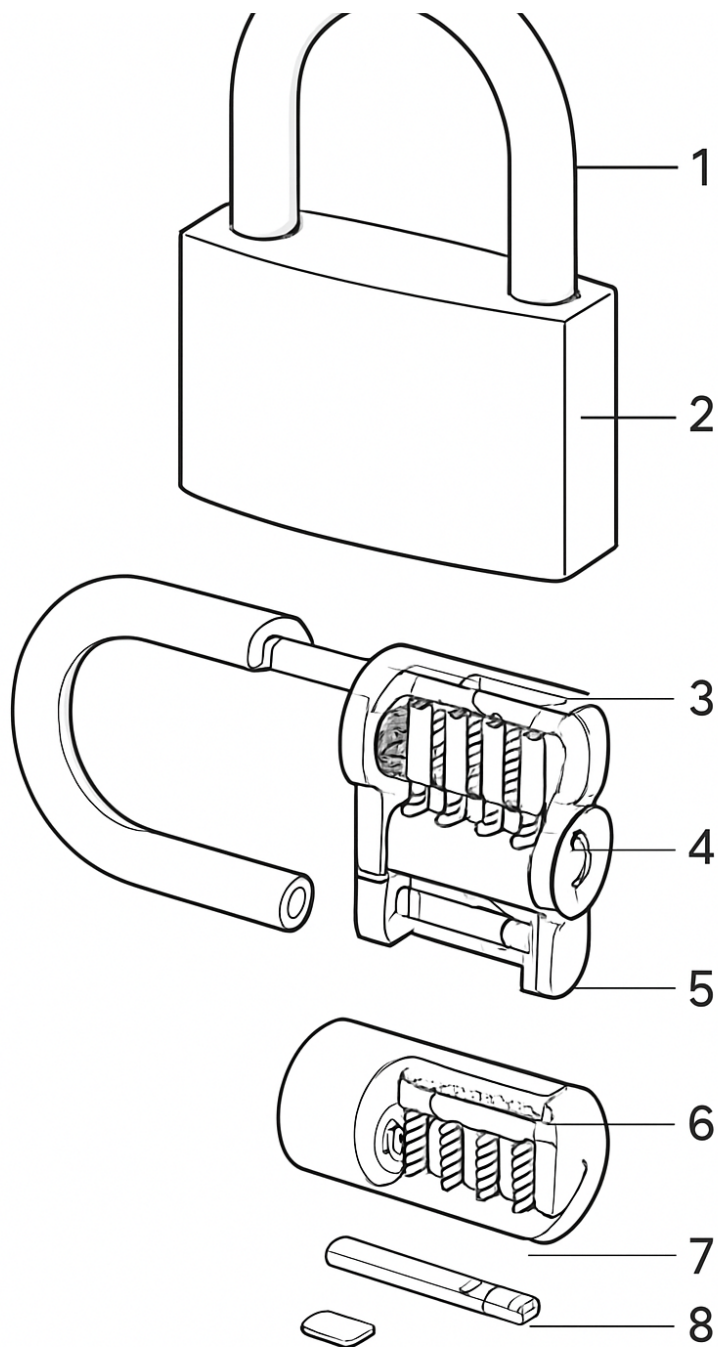
What a well-run service call looks like from start to finish
